Topic: History

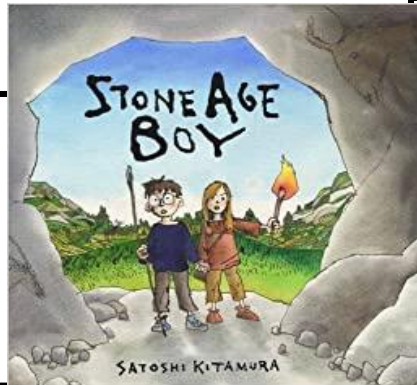
The Stone Age Period:
