

Year 3 Curriculum Map 2020

Term 3 - Ancient Greece

English

Fiction: Children will learn the story of 'Theseus and the Minotaur'. We will be exploring the plots of Myths and Legends from Ancient Greece to inspire our own mythological writing.

Poetry: 'Pegasus' by Eleanor Farjeon. We will create our own mythological creature poems.

Non-fiction: Discussion. We will consider the differences between the two rival city states in Ancient Greece; Athens and Sparta

Grammar: Punctuating direct speech. Spelling rules.

Maths


Multiplication & Division: We will continue to learn the formal written methods. The children will learn to multiply and divide a two digit number by a one digit number. They will also learn to divide 100 into 2, 4, 5 and 10 equal parts. (3 weeks)

Measurement: The children will learn to solve problems involving money, including counting coins and giving change. (1 week)

Statistics: We will be teaching the children how to draw and interpret tally charts, pictograms, bar charts and tables. (2 weeks)

Science

Our Science coverage will be a human body and nutrition focus. We will identify that humans and animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement. We will consider what constitutes a balanced diet.



Art & Design

In Art this term we will be looking at Greek mythical creatures and using our drawing skills to create hybrids of animals.

We will then be printing the hybrids using press-printing techniques.

Computing

We will learn how to use and apply algorithms in both real life and computing contexts.

Coding: 'Scratch' - to develop skills.

E-safety: How to be safe and sensible on the internet.

Languages

In French this term, we will be learning more basic vocabulary related to parts of the body, numbers 20 to 31, and the months of the year. Our Song is: **Têtes, épaules, genoux et pieds.**

PSHE

Our theme for a New Year is 'Dreams and Goals'

Jigsaw: Our main task this term will be to create our own Garden of Dreams and Goals.

P.E. - Games (invasion)

Creating power and accuracy in throwing / catching; moving the ball forward to invade; competitive games based on attack / defence. E.g. capture the flag. The children will also be expected to develop an understanding of a fair game.

Focus: Christianity

Could Jesus heal people? Were these miracles?

Topic

Ancient Greece

Locational knowledge: Where was Ancient Greece?

The children will learn Greek myths and legends and will be introduced to the many exciting Greek Gods, Goddesses and Monsters.
