**Year 5**  
**Term 5 2021**

**English**

In English lessons we will read and explore a range of different texts based around the theme of World War One. Images and illustrations play a major role in all the texts we will focus on.

- *Line of Fire - Diary of an Unknown Soldier*
- *Finding Winnie - The Story of the real bear who inspired Winnie the Pooh*

We will also read a range of war poetry.

**DT**

We shall be working with textiles to plan, design and evaluate a project linked to World War One.

**Art and Design**

We will be use a range of different media to create artwork inspired by poppies and bees.

**Maths**

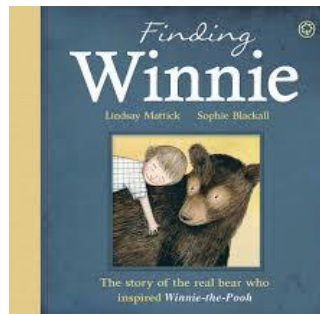
- Decimals (adding & subtracting decimals, decimal sequences, multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000)
- Geometry and property of shapes
- Measurement and conversion of units

**Science**

This term in Science our topic will be **forces**. We will be looking at gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction. We will also investigate the effect of levers, pulleys and gears. Throughout the term we will carry out a range of practical investigations.

**PE**

- We will continue with a few sessions of tag rugby at the beginning of term, building on our skills and playing matches.

- Athletics (Track and Field)



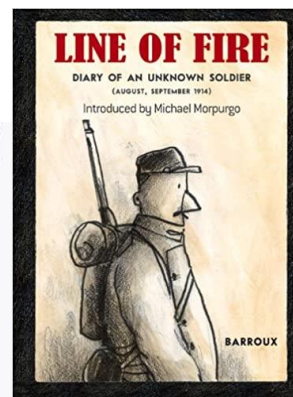
**PSHE**
